President's Message...

Dear fellow members of Angle East,

It is my pleasure to welcome Angle East back to Toronto, which we last visited in 2002. My personal roots in Toronto go back to 1994, which is when I met my wife, Sharon, then a resident of Scarborough. Since then, I have spent much time in and around the area, both for family visits and professional activities with the Royal College of Dentists of Canada. I have come to think of Toronto as a second home and I hope you will enjoy your visit here.

Historically, the city's modern origins go back to the early 17th century. According to one story, a lieutenant of Samuel de Champlain was sent into the area around the year 1615. He eventually came to find an area between two rivers, now known as the Don and the Humber, a place which was occupied by the Huron people. The name of this area, according to this account, meant 'meeting place', but this may not be the real story of the name. The region was known in the Iroquois language as tkaronto, which has been translated as 'where there are trees standing in the water'. The name Taronto stuck under the French on their territorial maps and, when the region was purchased from the Missasaugas in the late 1700s by Lord Dorchester, the transaction was known as the Toronto Purchase. Also known as the city of York (thanks to John Graves Simcoe, 1st Lieutenant General of Upper Canada), the name Toronto was written into the city charter in the early 1800s.

Whatever the name origins, Toronto has always been a meeting place and important center for commerce from well before the 1600s to the present, being close to the western end of the St. Lawrence Seaway. Much more than that though, Toronto has become one of the important metropolitan centers, not only of Canada, but also, of North America. It is a leading cultural hub, with important centers for art, music and theatre. Toronto boasts professional sports franchises in hockey, basketball, baseball and football and the city is also home to some of the best cuisine in North America.

Toronto is our meeting place in 2019. Arranging and holding our annual meeting is a team effort and I have been most fortunate to have a truly great team working with me. After Harvey Peck's sudden death in 1981, his fellow-members of the Eastern Component felt that a memorial must be established to honor this great contribu-

tor to the fabric and dynamics of the Angle Society. Irving Buchin, our Director to the Central Body in 1982, suggested that a charitable fund be initiated in Harvey's memory. By 1984, Irv's initiatives had blossomed into the Eastern Component's highest recognition, the Harvey Peck Memorial Award. Jack Dale created a handsome award certificate to be presented to a member or other contributor for his or her high achievement in the pursuit of excellence in the specialty of orthodontics. Seven years elapsed before it was first presented to Wilfred Cohen in 1991.
